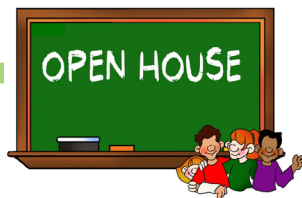

## Tardy Policy

After safety, student learning is our top priority. Students are expected to be in their seats by 7:55 a.m. ready to learn. Students arriving to school after 8 a.m. will need to be walked into the office by a parent and signed-in to obtain a tardy slip and enter the classroom. If your student is consistently late, or if your student is not being signed in by a parent or a guardian, please expect a courtesy call from the school. We are your partners in expressing the importance of punctuality and responsibility to your child. We thank you for making the effort to get your child to class each day and on time.

## Safety First at Arrival & Dismissal

Remember to follow these tips to keep traffic flowing and students safe. If you are using the car loop....



- Be sure to honor the 5mph posted speed limit
- Refrain from using cell phones
- Do not use Pineapple Cove's parking area
- Always display your carloop pick-up sign in your window
- Remember, when turning onto Eldron, RIGHT turns ONLY during arrival and dismissal times
- Reserve disabled parking for vehicles with disabled parking permits
- Always drop off children at the designated orange cones – no where else in the carloop area

## Student Check Out

Students may be checked out of school by their parent/legal guardian, or a designee specified in writing by the parent/legal guardian. When checking a student out of school, photo identification must be presented to our front office staff. Students may not be checked out after 2:00 p.m.

In order to maintain the order and focus in our classrooms, we ask that you not bring forgotten items to your student during the school day.

We are your partners in expressing the importance of regular attendance to your child. We thank you for making the effort to get your child to school each day and finishing each school day at the set dismissal time.

## Student Medication

Any students requiring medication during the school day must have a parent check the medication into the front office and fill out the appropriate medication form. Students may not bring medication to school at any time. If a student requires an asthma inhaler on his/her person, the inhaler must be checked in through the office and must be accompanied by a doctor prescription stating that the child must carry the inhaler with them at all times.

## Student Insurance

Brevard County Schools are not responsible for paying medical expenses due to accidents or injuries that occur during school, sports, or other activities. If your child is not covered under a healthcare policy, you may be interested in the low cost Student Accident Insurance Plan. The plan can provide supplemental coverage if you already have a plan, or provide basic coverage if you have no insurance. Plan options are also available if you choose to add other benefits such as extended 24 hour coverage and dental coverage. Rates are designed to be affordable and start at \$10 for elementary students for coverage at school for a 9 month term. Forms are available in the front office and should be returned to the insurance agency office. ## Tutoring

Parents who are curious about Odyssey's tutoring program – stay tuned for more information. OCS offers a free tutoring program to all 3rd-6th graders at the Lower Campus. The Upper Campus will also offer free tutoring as well. Tutoring is intended for any students who received Level 1 or 2 FCAT scores the past school year.

## Healthy Café

Odyssey has a full service cafeteria ready to feed healthy, fresh meals made daily for all of our school community and their families. Parents and siblings are welcome to sign into the front office and join their student for lunch.

Payment for breakfast and lunch can be made by check (made out to Odyssey Charter School) or cash. Payment may be brought to the classroom where the teacher will record the payment information. Families may make out one check for multiple children – please note on the check the amount per student. Prepayments are always welcome.

A la carte items range from \$0.50 to \$1.50 and are strictly optional to purchase. If families do not want their children to have the option of purchasing a la carte items, please inform the Café Manager or Cashier.

If your child has allergies to any foods, please send in a doctor's note. If your child has a milk allergy and would like juice served to them at lunch, the doctor's prescription must state that juice should be substituted for milk.

Healthy Café Prices:

Breakfast - \$1.00 (full pay); \$0.30 (reduced price\*)  
Lunch - \$2.50 (K-6th full pay); \$0.40 (reduced price\*)

Free and \*Reduced prices are for students who qualify for either a free or a reduced price meal according to the Federal School Lunch Program. All families are strongly encouraged to fill out free and reduced lunch forms during our registration. If you would like a form, please contact the front office or the café.

  - Step 5: Present issue at the next monthly Board of Directors Meeting if unresolved
  - Step 6: Seek mediation with the Sponsor
