SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

The School Advisory Council, known as SAC, is an organization of parents, teachers, and community members who act as a resource to the school and the Principals. The team represents the views of the school community in order to develop solutions to problems that affect the school and its students.

Members of the SAC team meet each month for approximately one hour. The SAC is made up of the School Principals, chairpersons, a secretary and other representatives. DRESS DOWN DAYS – September 28 and October 26

On the last Friday of each month, students on both campuses are allowed to dress down out of uniform. Students must still be in compliance with the Brevard County Dress Code. Parents may find links to both the elementary and secondary parent handbooks on the school's website.

In our school community, students are taught the philosophy of respect for life. They learn to respect oneself, each other, and their indoor and outdoor environment. Along with this respect is an inherent message that we are accountable to each other and to the care of the earth we live upon. During certain times of the year on Dress Down days, students may use a hour of the school day to further develop and demonstrate this care for their learning environment, both indoors and outdoors.

5517.01 POLICY AGAINST BULLYING AND HARASSMENT

Odyssey Charter School follows the Brevard Public Schools Student Code of Conduct. In response to a new state law, the Jeffrey Johnston Stand Up for all Students Act, the Brevard County School Board recently adopted a policy that prohibits bullying and harassment. The policy ensures that all students, employees, and volunteers learn and work in an environment that is safe, secure, and free from harassment and bullying of any kind. Florida is now one of 32 states with a law regarding bullying in schools.



The Policy defines Bullying as systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students or employee and may involve but is not limited to: teasing, social exclusion, threat, intimidation, stalking, including cyberstalking, physical violence, theft, sexual, religious, or racial harassment, public humiliation, and destruction of property.

The policy defines harassment as any threatening, insulting, or dehumanizing gesture, use of data or computer software, or written, verbal or physical conduct directed against a student or employee that: Places a student or employee in reasonable fear of harm to his or her person or damage to his or her property, has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's educational performance, opportunities, or benefits, has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of a school.

Odyssey Charter School is committed to providing a safe learning environment and will not tolerate bullying or harassment of any kind. TARDY POLICY

Being tardy to class disrupts learning for all students. Students are required to report to their classrooms ready to learn at the Lower Campus by 7:55 a.m. and at the Upper Campus by 8:45 a.m.

Students tardy on either campus must be walked into the office and signed in by a parent in order to obtain a tardy slip and enter their classroom. Chronically tardy students will be referred to the principal.

For the middle school student, excessive tardiness to school may result in detention before school or other appropriate disciplinary action. Detention will be issued after three (3) tardies to school. Students present, but tardy to their classes, must report to the Principal. Detentions will be assigned on Tuesday and Thursday from 7:45-8:45.

Students must bring materials to study during detentions. Students who do not bring materials will be considered unprepared and further disciplinary action will be taken. At least one day's written notice will be given to the student and parent concerning the date and time of the detention.

INTERNATIONAL WALK TO SCHOOL DAY

Walking and bicycling to school enables children to incorporate the regular physical activity they need each day while also forming healthy habits that can last a lifetime. Regular physical activity helps children build strong bones, muscles and joints, and it decreases the risk of obesity. In contrast, insufficient physical activity can contribute to chronic diseases, such as diabetes, heart disease, cancer and stroke.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services recommends that children and adolescents get one hour or more of physical activity each day. Research suggests that physically active kids are more likely to become healthy, physically active adults, underscoring the importance of developing the habit of regular physical activity early.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES

Step 1: Request Teacher conference to clarify issue
Step 2: Contact Principal if unresolved with the teacher
Step 3: **Contact Constance Ortiz at Academia Central Florida Management Company

Step 4: Contact the President of the Governing Board
Step 5: Present issue at the next monthly Board of Directors Meeting if unresolved
Step 6: Seek mediation with the Sponsor

MAKE-UP WORK

Students have the right to make up work missed due to absences. However, to receive credit the assignment has to be successfully completed and turned in within ten (10) days of the absence. A student who is absent on a pre-announced test date should be prepared to take the test on the day of his/her return to class, unless other reasonable arrangements are made with the teacher. We give the teachers at least twenty-four (24) hours to have the homework ready in the attendance area. Please call the attendance office prior to picking up the homework.

STUDENT CHECKOUT

Students may be checked out of school by their parent, legal guardian or a designee specified in writing by the parent or legal guardian. When checking a student out of school, please present photo identification to our front office staff.

In order to maintain the order and focus in our classrooms, children will not be called from class to retrieve items brought to them during the school day. If a student forgets an item, we ask that you keep the item at home and have the student bring it to school the next day. If a student forgets lunch items, the front office will notify the teacher before the students lunch period and the student will pick up the lunch item on the way to the café.

Students may not be checked out after 2:00 pm at the lower campus (K-6th) or 3:00 pm at the upper campus (6th honors-8th). Any exceptions to this rule must be approved by the principal.

Social Cause: The Invisible Children Movement

A part of our school's philosophy for our middle school student is to help them become global citizens who are aware of and capable of making life better for themselves, others and the planet they live upon. We seek to help them connect to greater meaning through social causes that will enable them to further develop empathy and a caring for life, wherever it may be.

On Friday, October 19th, the Upper Campus students will take part in a film currently in production and suitable for Middle School students on The Invisible Children Movement. The theme of the film will mostly center around inherent connections among all of us, using dance as an example of a universal language. The movement is composed of a global community of young people that look to bring a permanent end to the recruitment of child soldiers in the remote border regions of the South Sudan, the Democratic Republic of Congo, and the Central American Republic. A central idea of the Invisible Children Movement is the idea that human life is equal and that where you live shouldn't determine whether you live.
