## State Assessment News

The state of Florida has released some state assessment scores. A summary of our GREAT results for all released scores is listed below. Please note that individual student score reports for 5th and 8th grade Science and for Biology and Civics EOC's will be available from the school's front office beginning July 13th. Math and English/ Language Arts results from the new state test called the FSA, are not expected to be available until late September.

### ***DID YOU KNOW?***

Odyssey had 83% of 3rd grade students pass the brand new FSA Reading assessment, one of the highest pass levels in the City of Palm Bay. Congratulations to our hard-working 3rd grade students, dedicated teachers, and the 3rd grade families for their support!

### ***DID YOU KNOW?***

On the Spring 2015 5th grade Science FCAT, Odyssey students were in the top three schools in Palm Bay for academic performance. Congratulations to our 5th grade budding scientists, their teachers, and our science coach for their hard work this year.

### ***DID YOU KNOW?***

92% of the OCS Jr/Sr High 7th grade students scored proficient or higher on the Civics End-Of-Course Assessment this spring. **This was the third highest score in all Brevard Public Schools, placing OCS in the top 5% of the state.** Go 7th Grade (now rising 8th grade) Titans!

### ***DID YOU KNOW?***

Odyssey's 8th grade FCAT Science scores significantly surpassed all surrounding public and charter schools serving Palm Bay, as well as the Brevard County School District and State of Florida. The hard work of the students and teachers paid off! Congratulations. Here are the percentages: Odyssey – 65%, Southwest – 46%, Stone – 39%, Central – 52%, Royal Palm – 41%, Palm Bay Academy – 41%, Brevard District – 48%, State of Florida – 55%.

## DID YOU KNOW?

OCS Jr/Sr High 9th grade students significantly outperformed Bayside, Heritage, and Palm Bay High and the state average on their Biology End-of-Course Assessments this spring. They will certainly do well as they move into the OCS Jr/Sr High 10th grade class. Keep up the great work!

## OCS Jr/Sr High STEM A2

The Odyssey Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics Academic Acceleration Program (STEM A2) is a program for students who are gifted, talented, interested, and motivated in deeper STEM knowledge and skills. Honors/Pre AP/AP STEM A2 courses place a special emphasis on mathematics and science competency-driven learning experiences that are integrative, inquiry-based, and problem-centered. By participating in the STEM A2 program, students will acquire knowledge and skills that transfer across content areas and help participants deepen their investigative, synthesis, analysis, comprehension, problem-solving, communication, and leadership skills. Key STEM A2 components include:

- **Challenging Curriculum** - The program offers challenging/rigorous inquiry-based, experiential curricula related to real-world applications that encourage critical thinking, problem solving, and team work. The program expectations go beyond minimum competencies, as well as local, state and/or national standards.
- **Inquiry-Based Learning Environment** – STEM A2 offers a learning environment where students work together as active learners and teachers facilitate student discovery. STEM A2 teachers have access to and time allotted for professional development that hones their science knowledge and experiential teaching approach. Students have necessary curriculum materials to ignite their thinking and promote hands-on outcome-based learning. Student diversity, individuality, and uniqueness are recognized and respected in the community of learners.
- **Culture of Learning** – STEM A2 students have personal short term and long term goals for learning that are developed at the start of their STEM A2 courses. Student participants are expected to be motivated in the classroom, school, and broader community through community and service learning projects.

### Applying for STEM A2

Students wishing to apply for the STEM A2 program need to submit a two letters of recommendation and a cover letter to Dr. Monica Knight, site administrator, explaining why they are a good candidate for the STEM Academic Acceleration program, along with two letters of recommendation from teachers or community members. These letters should be submitted no later than June 30 of each year.

- Step 2: Contact the Site Administrator if unresolved with the teacher
- Step 3: \*\*Contact Board Designated Parent Representative
- Step 4: Contact the President of the Governing Board
- Step 5: Present issue at the next monthly Board Meeting if unresolved
- Step 6: Seek mediation with the Sponsor
