## SCHOOL STORE

Odyssey's Safety Patrol will be reopening the SCHOOL STORE!! The school store will open Monday February 6th and will be located just outside of the cafeteria in the main hallway. The school store will be open each morning from 7:40 until 7:50 for students to purchase items. There will be NO SALES after 7:50 to ensure that students are arriving to class on time.

Each item sold in our School Store is priced in 25 cent increments and are typically no more than \$2 per item for convenience. To kick off the start of the school store in February we will not only be selling school supplies but we will also be selling "Send A Bit of Joy" hearts. These are quite simply a heart shaped note of encouragement or a kind thought which students can send to one another for just 25 cents throughout the ENTIRE MONTH of February (or until they are sold out).
