Recent Events

We held our annual School Spelling Bee on January 19 with winners from each 4th and 5th homeroom competing to represent our school. We had 8 Spelling Bee participants who went 26 rounds. Congratulations to Andrew P. who is our Spelling Bee winner!







First grade students had the opportunity to view the rocket launch on January 13, 2022, and were able to hear and feel the sonic boom!



Our GATEway students work on Engineering Design concepts as they team up to design a robot to complete a task (simulating removal of toxic waste).



Our 2nd grade students enjoyed field trips to the Barrier Island Sanctuary in Melbourne Beach to learn about the three types of sea turtles we see nesting on our Florida beaches (loggerhead, green, and leatherback), what they eat, how to identify their nesting sites, and how to make the beach friendlier for sea turtles to nest.



Our 4th grade students have undertaken the care of our Memorial Peace Garden and are learning how to lovingly tend it.



Our Conservation/Environmental Club is working on creating a Food Forrest Gardening space for our 5th grades, are learning about recycling (recycled tree!), and are participating in some stewardship opportunities (cleaning up a local community area).







From our Instructional Coaches

Elementary students have access to iReady, Amplify Core Knowledge Language Arts (CKLA), and Discovery Science online programs to support instruction in the Florida State Standards. iReady provides individualized online instruction that targets each student's individual needs in reading and math. Discovery Science offers articles and videos that help deepen students' understanding of grade level content.

• Students are encouraged to utilize iReady for 45 minutes per week in both reading and math to progress toward their expected annual growth.

• Students are encouraged to use Discovery Science to explore their digital textbook and explore further, topics discussed in class.

After-School tutoring begins Tuesday February 2, 2022. Tutoring is by invitation only and limited slots are available. A separate acceptance letter is sent home to confirm a child's participation in the tutoring program.

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Tardy Policy

Elementary students are expected to be in their seats and ready to learn by 8:00am. If you are not entering the school driveway by 7:55am, you will likely not be at cone drop off by 8:00am. If a student arrives at 8:00am or later, parents must park and walk their child to the front office, sign them in, and receive a tardy pass for admittance to class. Parents, please do not park in the fire lane – this is a safety concern. We thank you for making the effort to have your student to class on time each and every day.

Breakfast and Student Arrival

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Students arriving prior to 7:20am are to report to our Before Care Program. Students can be dropped off for breakfast beginning at 7:20am. Please ensure your child is dropped off in plenty of time to eat a healthy breakfast.

Silent Dismissal

In the near future we will be implementing a new dismissal program called Silent Dismissal to dismiss students for car loop and day care vans. This digital program will allow students to stay in their class-rooms rather than travel to hallway locations to wait for their vehicles, making more productive use of that time. Students may begin homework, work on i-Ready, work with their teacher in a small group, or read. Families will be provided with a new dismissal car tag with a number and/or QR code that must be displayed upon entering the driveway. All other aspects of dismissal will remain the same (i.e. 3rd-5th grade families will line up in the right lane and dismiss at cones near the Multi-Purpose room; K-2nd grade families and those with older siblings will line up in the left lane and dismiss at cones along the front of the school). Look for more information to come home in the next several weeks!
